

## 2012 National Electric Flight Rally Twin Cities Club Field - Location and Facilities

The Twin Cities Club field is a highly developed flying site just a few kilometres north of Albury. Whichever way you are travelling, watch out for the Thurgoona Drive turn-off north of Albury on the Hume Highway bypass. Turn north on to the old highway near Springdale Heights. Travel north for a few kilometres until you see the Gerogery Road turn-off on your left. The road marked Wagga Road on the map below is now sign-posted Gerogery Road. Take the Gerogery Road and after about 200m turn left on to Central Reserve Road. The field is just over 1km along this road on the right.

The club has developed a new catering centre with a dozen or so lounge chairs. This will be in full operation for our event. At the rear is a covered area surrounded by a low wall affectionately called the “beer garden”. It is furnished with tables and chairs.

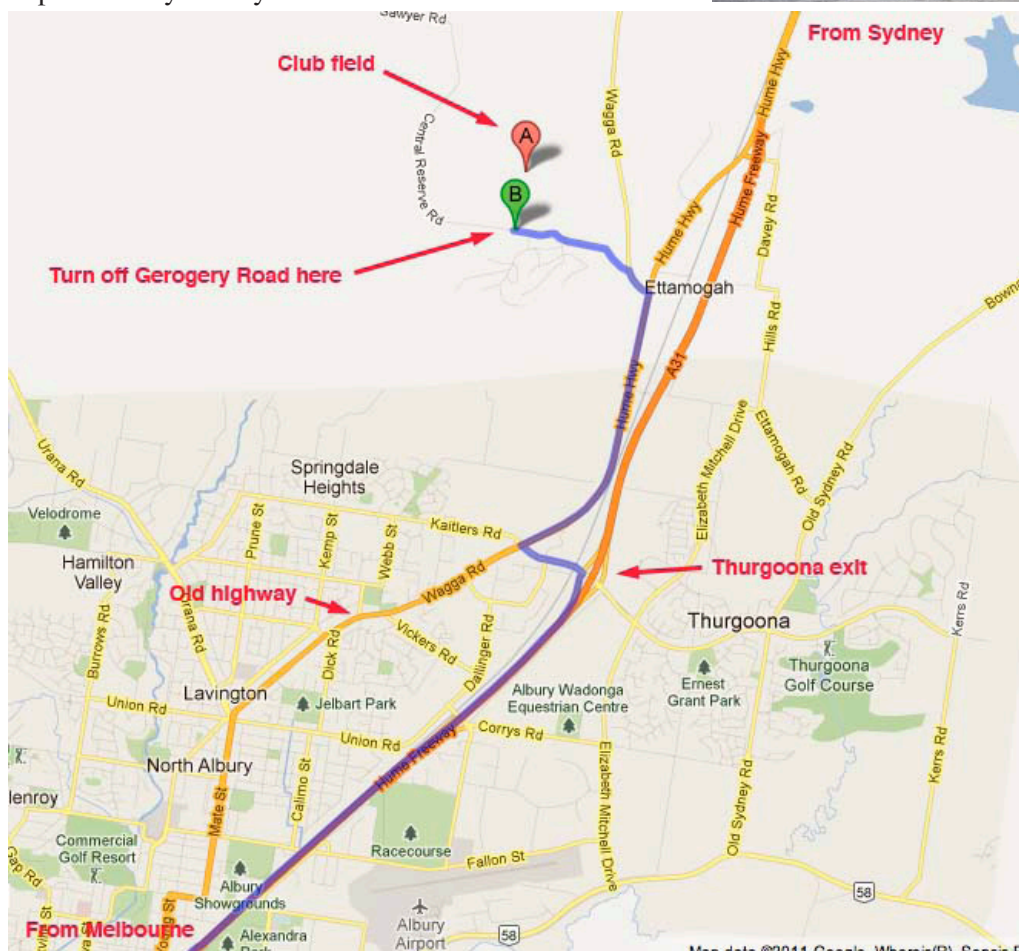
The extensive pits area is surfaced with rubber matting and is covered with shade cloth. Seats are provided just inside and just outside this area. The take-off strips and apron are also surfaced with rubber matting. The total field area will be mown for our event (to cater for glider tasks) and the obstructions will be removed from the centre of the field.

Brand new flushing toilets have recently been constructed and provide an excellent amenity for participants.

Our thanks go to the Twin Cities Club for providing their field over the busy Easter period for our event. Take advantage of the superb facilities provided by the club field, and the extensive accommodation and wide range of eateries provided by Albury.
